Vice President's Report: Glenna Shephard

A large donation has been made to GALA Quilt Guild by the family of Laura Lucy whose husband has been stationed at Ft. Moore. Laura died unexpectedly a few months ago. She taught herself to quilt while she and her husband were stationed in Italy. Her Mother in Law belongs to a quilt guild in California. Laura's husband and mother-in-law urged her to join GALA, but Laura didn't think her quilts were good enough...they were/are beautiful!! And have all been sent to family members.

In February, Linda Walker and a few others brought all that was donated to the church. At the May 18th GALA meeting, we will have a yard sale. All the items from Laura's "stash" will be priced, very reasonably, and available for purchase by guild members. The money raised help fund workshops and other events for GALA.

We can also bring vintage/antique quilts for Ryan to look at and she will tell us what she can about the vintage/antique quilts.

Four of our guild members took part in the Barn Quilt Painting at Ft. Mitchell on Saturday, March 9th. If there is enough interest, we can plan to do a Barn Quilt Painting session of our own. There were several interested members.

New Business:

Possibility of a Mini Retreat: Audrey Bergeron showed a Tulip block she has made and has agreed to teach us how to make a table runner of these blocks. The Mini-retreat would be held in Phenix City over a weekend in July. More details to come.

- **BOM** - (Becca Chester) Tiptoe Through the Tulips from Riley Blake 2023 Challenge pattern. We are using the Hand-dyed Batik fabrics (first one) on the chart that was given out last month as our color pallet.
- You do not have to purchase the Riley Blake fabrics. Use what you have in your stash that is similar.
- The blocks will each be one of the Riley Blake blocks. The idea is to make your BOM to turn in and make a second block with fabric from your own stash. At the end of the year, if you have made and returned all 11 blocks you will receive 5 additional patterns you could make to add to your set to complete a quilt top. The winner of the BOM blocks each month has a bonus of blocks to go in their own quilt.
- These blocks will all be **10.5 inch blocks (10" finished.)** This is a change from what we have done before.
- **Quilts of Valor block** - Pat Carlson was not able to attend the meeting. Rebecca took up the finished QoV blocks for last month.
